**ENGLISH MARTYRS' SCHOOL 1965 – 2015: PROJECT GHANA;** As many of you are already aware English Martyrs' is celebrating its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this school year. After 50 years of wonderful education the children and staff wanted to do something special to help other children and leave a lasting legacy. So in friendship with The Becket School we have been raising funds to help build a new school for the children of Our Lady of Hope Parish, Bunkpurgu, Ghana. We set ourselves the target of £10,000 and incredibly the children have raised **over £8,000** already! This included winning a countrywide project donating the £5,000 prize money to our total. On **Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2016**, the staff of English Martyrs' will be embarking on a 12 mile Parishes walk to help raise funds for the project. **SLAWEK'S STORY:** Although I am just an ordinary man who likes family life and cycling, my cause is extraordinary because my fundraising will, I believe, help to save precious human lives. When I found out that approximately 800 abortions are carried out every working day in the UK, I decided to do something to make a difference. My intention is to raise awareness about this terrible fact and try to save 800 human beings in the UK in a symbolic way this one particular day 26<sup>th</sup> in June 2016 when I will be cycling in the Cycle Live Nottingham event. I hope that I will be able to complete 50 miles on a bike without any gears in 4 hours. Please, be generous and help me to do it and come to the finishing line at 10 am to celebrate life. How will the money raised be spent? Recently, during the 40 days of Lent I had an opportunity to participate in a great pro-life initiative at the Queen's Medical Centre in Nottingham called 40 Days For Life. We seek, through prayer and fasting, to end abortion in our community because although it is legal, it is terribly harmful. As well as killing babies, it hurts women and their families. It also harms the medical staff who carry out the abortions. We believe that our prayers will ultimately convert the hearts of all those people involved with abortion from mothers and fathers of the unborn through the medical staff and even politicians. For God, nothing is impossible! All the money which is raised from my cycle ride will help with the costs of a 40
