I know deeply the frustration of not being able to offer them regular gift of the Blessed Sacrament; my own parishes' outreach Ministers tell of that ache. I hope that at Corpus Christi we will find ways of honouring our Eucharistic Lord in countless streams and in personal prayers. I hope that you will find time personally to re – commit yourself to continued ministry. Furthermore, I hope that we will pray for each other, that soon the cloud may lift, and we can be of pastoral personal service to our Lord and his faithful people again. Trinity Sunday

If a Christian were to get into a theological conversation with a non – Christian, one of the first things that may come up is the mystery of the Holy Trinity, which we celebrate each year on this Trinity Sunday. Non – Christians, such as Jews and Muslims, believe there is one God, all – powerful and transcendent. Their concept of God resembles what appears in the Old Testament. A simplified, non – Christian idea of God, rejects what Jesus revealed about the Holy Trinity, that God is three Divine Persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – but one Divine Nature. That rejection certainly limits the room for theological controversy, but it also cancels out the whole New Testament, which Jews and Muslims do not accept. And so, of the world's monotheistic religions, only Christianity believes in the Trinity. It is unique to us. Now it is true that the Trinity is hard to understand. How can God be both One and Three? How can the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit be fully God and yet distinct Persons? Our minds cannot grasp this completely. And yet, that very fact makes the doctrine of the Trinity ring true. It shows that no merely human mind would have been able to come up with it. And it also shows that God, the Creator of the universe, exists in a way that we, mere creatures, cannot fully understand – and that makes perfect sense: God *should* exceed our ability to understand Him; if He didn't He wouldn't be much of a God!

But just because we cannot understand the Trinity completely does not mean we cannot understand it at all. The great apologist Frank Sheed (Sheed & Ward) used to give a very interesting explanation of the Most Holy Trinity. He started by thinking about our own human nature. Each one of us exists, but since we are spiritual, we also have an idea of ourselves. We can think about ourselves, reflect on ourselves, know ourselves. This is why human beings are the only animals on earth who write diaries. That is similar to what happens in the relationship between God the Father and God the Son. God the Father is spiritual, able to know Himself. He has an idea of Himself. But, since His knowledge is limitless, unlike ours, that idea of Himself is perfect, perfectly complete. But to be perfect, it has to share in God's own existence; it has to actually be a Divine Person. And so, God the Father, from all eternity, knowing Himself, engenders the Son, the perfect image of the Father. And then, of course, since both the Father and the Son are infinitely good and beautiful, as soon as they know each other, they also love each other. Even we, when we think about ourselves, love ourselves. We want the best for ourselves. We are glad that we exist. But God's love, like His knowledge, is unlimited and so it too has to be so intense and so full that it shares fully in the Divine Existence; it is a Divine Person – the Holy Spirit. This is the mystery we profess in the Creed when we affirm our belief in the Son of God, who is, "begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father, God from God, Light from Light," and in the Holy Spirit, "who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified."

This mysterious and wonderful doctrine about God, that He is both unity and trinity, is called by the Catechism "the central mystery of Christian faith and life." (CCC 234). The Catechism goes on to say, "It is the mystery of God in Himself." Think about that for a moment. We, as Christians, have been given a privilege that no one else in the history of the world has been given: we are able to know God from the inside. Philosophers and others who follow merely natural religions only know about God, from the outside. But we, through Christ's grace, have actually begun to know God as He knows Himself. That is how much God has loved us. We are actually members of the Divine Family; we are actually friends of God; insiders in the Kingdom of Heaven. Friends open their hearts to each other; they share secret thoughts, affections and desires. That is what makes friendship so beautiful and so valuable. God, through Jesus Christ, has offered us this kind of friendship with Him: He has revealed His innermost thoughts and identity. Here on earth we only perceive it dimly (see 1 Corinthians 1312), but if we let Him, the Holy Spirit will strengthen our supernatural eyesight so we can see and know Him better and know all things as He knows them. When we profess our faith in this Triune God who has loved us so deeply, let us thank Him for this truly incredible gift. And let us promise Him that we will never take it for granted, but every time we pray in the name of the Father and, of the Son and, of the Holy Spirit, we will renew our commitment to live lives worthy of the Divine Friendship, the Divine Adoption that we have received.
